Sturdy Boots or wellingtons, gloves, trousers and long sleeved top.</p> <p>Ensure that any hand held tools provided or supplied by Parish Council Members/volunteers are in a good condition and working order. Ensure hand tools are maintained/repared as required. Do not use broken hand tools. Use the correct tool for the work activity.</p>	<p>Parish Council to ensure that suitable protective clothing is worn by Parish Council members and any volunteers assisting with the clearing of vegetation or debris.</p> <p>Check the mobile phone signal prior to undertaking work to ensure assistance can be summoned in the event of an emergency.</p> <p>Carry a suitable First Aid Box for the work activity.</p> <p>If working in a field which has livestock contact the landowner prior to the designated day to ask if the livestock can be removed or contained away from the working area.</p>

Infection from treated timber.</p>	<p>Always wear long trousers, sturdy footwear, gloves and any member of the working group lifting and handling materials wear steel-toe cap boots/shoes. Wear suitable eye protection if concrete or stone is to be broken up. Signs must be displayed at entrance areas of the footpath to inform other users of the footpath that the footpath is being cleared. Consideration to be given to posting a person on the footpath to request walkers to find an alternative route whilst the Waymark Posts/gates are being erected.</p>	<p>If working in a field which has livestock contact the landowner prior to the designated day to ask if the livestock can be removed or contained away from the working area. Cover any cuts and wash hands before eating particularly if animals have been touched</p> <p>Ensure that all volunteers and members of the Parish Council have been trained in the use of the hand tools to be used.</p>

Example raised roots/vegetation, slippery, holes etc Check weather forecast prior to undertaking work activity and do not undertake work during wet/windy or severe weather.</p> <p>Wear suitable protective clothing, footwear, gloves, trousers etc</p>	<p>Check the mobile phone signal prior to undertaking work to ensure assistance can be summoned in the event of an emergency.</p> <p>Carry a suitable First Aid Box during the work activity.</p> <p>Check Met office weather warnings on line prior to undertaking work activity.</p>

Inform a member of the Parish Council date and times and which footpaths are to be cleared. Contact the member of the Parish Council once the work activity is completed.</p> <p>If a member of the public/landowner/householder becomes verbally or physically abusive leave the area and refer to them to the Chair or Vice Chair of the Parish Council.</p> <p>Contact the police for advice.</p>	<p>Consider if it is appropriate to undertake lone working. Arrange for an additional person to accompany the operator during the work activity.</p>

(work in the shade) during hot weather.</p> <p>Ensure there are areas to shelter to retain a suitable body temperature during periods of cold/wet weather</p>				
Using Hand Tools	<p>Contactors Members of the Parish Council Volunteers from the Community</p> <p>Cuts, bruises, fractures to bones in the body.
