Community Initiatives Fund 2016/17

Just a reminder that the Community Initiatives Fund is open for applications.

CIF

This fund is subject to a maximum application of £20,000 for any one project. It is for capital funding only and eligible areas of expenditure could include, community, social and recreational facilities, village halls (including church halls), community shops community transport initiatives (not for a single-use group), land purchases, playground equipment, environmental works and any related feasibility, design and planning work.

The deadline for Expressions of Interest is the 26 August 2016.

CIF Response

This fund is subject to a maximum application of £15,000 for any one project. Eligible projects for this funding are as described for the CIF. The difference is that applications for CIF Response funding will only be considered where the need is evidenced clearly by the applicant that funding is required for time-critical projects.

The final deadline for Expressions of Interest is the 27 January 2017.

Advance notification of Bus Consultation

4 August 2016 – 28 September 2016

In 2015 Essex County Council (ECC) began a thorough review of its financial support for those local bus services that it pays for across the County. This consultation is the start of the second part of the review and looks at 70 services across Essex where the current contract ends in 2017. We have grouped together services by geographical area of the County so it is easy to see whether your service is part of the review.

Most bus services in Essex are run by commercial operators. The County Council's role is to decide, where the commercial operators do not provide a service, whether one is needed and if it feels one is, then to provide it.

To help make this decision ECC looks at many factors including what alternatives are available, how many people use them and whether they offer value for money. The Council will not normally continue to support a service where it pays the operator £5.00 or more after all revenue (from fares of all types including the concessionary bus pass scheme) has been taken into account. This is the Cost Per Passenger Journey (CPPJ).

A number of the services in this review were last tendered in 2009/10 and the price agreed then is therefore relatively low compared to prices today. In addition ECC has frozen its fares since 2009, freezing revenue. As a result a number of bus services in this review are currently close to or exceeding the £5.00 CPPJ upper support limit and are very likely to exceed it after tender.

Given this position, the County Council is looking at a range of options for these services trying to reduce the cost of providing the services, while maintaining key transport links. This could mean reduced frequencies or reduced hours or days of operation or changes to routes. ECC also needs to manage the network in the light of changes to the commercial bus network, travel demand and changing corporate priorities over time.

From the start of the Consultation, **04 August 2016**, the consultation questionnaire will be available online (The link will be: <https://surveys.essexinsight.org.uk/BusConsultation>), and in paper copies which will be sent to parishes affected and be available through local libraries. Full information will be made available closer to the start of the consultation.

Salt Bag Partnership Scheme for Winter 2016/17 has been launched!
Closing date is the 22nd July 2016

To support local communities to help themselves during periods of heavy snow and build on their community resilience, Essex County Council (ECC) would like to make available to each participating **Town** and **Parish Council** a one tonne wrapped pallet made up of individual 25kg bags for use by the community on the local highway. ECC is offering this free of charge again this year.

On the 31st May we emailed all Town, Parish Councils asking if they wished to participate in the scheme in order that we can procure the volumes of salt needed and arrange delivery again for next winter.

This year, to improve the scheme and reduce costs we will be using an Online application form to log all the details and are asking if you:

1. would like to participate and require salt, or
2. participate but have enough salt left due to the mild winter, or
3. Won't be taking part

Delivery Information:

If you are signing up and need salt, the delivery of the salt is programmed to arrive in September to early October to allow you time to allocate to your Volunteers. Please note we will not be making ad-hoc or additional re-stock deliveries throughout Winter.

The salt will be delivered by a large lorry (a bit bigger than a dustbin lorry) and the salt will be removed from the lorry via a tail lift and then moved on a trolley to its final destination. Please note that the trolley does not go over uneven or loose ground (grass, pebbles etc.) or steep inclines. The location you identify for delivery must be able to accommodate this.

About the Scheme:

If you are new to the scheme and would like to know how to set up the scheme for your area, the following points should be considered:

- Identify the priority areas for your local community (these must be on the public highway and not for any other area such as private driveways) such as

footpaths outside local shops, doctors, access routes to main bus stops etc which are not *already* salted by ECC. The salting network is mapped on our Website here: <http://www.essexhighways.org/transport-and-roads/roads-and-pavements/winter-travel/salting-routes.aspx>

- Recruit volunteers in and around these areas – local businesses, nearby home owners, residents associations etc. Feedback indicates direct engagement is the most effective way to recruiting volunteers.
- Confirm that the volunteers are confident they are physically able to manually remove snow and then spread a thin layer of salt when required and provide them with Snow Clearance Guidance and Manual Handling information.
- Keep a record of these priority areas and the details of the volunteers who are nominated to clear snow/salt for each chosen location.
- Give each volunteer a bag/supply of salt to store in preparation for when it snows.

Scams Awareness Month

It is Scams Awareness Month and we (Essex Trading Standards) are setting up a SCAMnesty with Essex Police.

We're putting boxes in local centres where residents can drop off scam mail they receive (pretend prize draws, competitions, brochures, fake investment opportunities etc).

Lots of people, especially older people, are ashamed that they've fallen victim of scams like these – though it happens surprisingly often – so the SCAMnesty bins are where they can deposit the mail without interacting with anyone. Making that first step of reporting as easy as possible.

It means we get the intel, we can follow up with these people if we need to, and we can work towards stopping this from happening again.

Minerals and Waste Policy planning

On Friday 10 June Essex and Southend-on-Sea Councils submitted their **Replacement Waste Local Plan along with supporting documents to the Secretary of State for independent examination.** This is in accordance with Section 22 of the Town and County Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2012.

Please note that this is **not** an opportunity to submit comments. Preparation of the Waste Local Plan has involved several previous consultations where members of the public have been invited to submit comment.

The documents submitted to the Secretary of State are as follows:

- Replacement Waste Local Plan;
- Submission Policies Map;
- Sustainability Appraisal & Strategic Environmental Assessment;
- Consultation Statement;
- Schedule of all representations received through Pre-Submission Draft Plan engagement;
- Pre-Submission Draft Plan: Report of Outcomes
- Supporting documents including the Strategic Flood Risk Assessment and the Habitat Regulations Assessment

Development Management Planning news

Planning permission (ESS/16/15/CHL) was issued on 6 June 2016 for sand and gravel extraction with restoration to pre-existing levels with inert waste at **Blackley Quarry, Great Leighs**. The site will be progressively restored to agriculture. The planning permission is subject to conditions and a legal agreement.

On 24 June 2016 the Development & Regulation committee granted approval for a building extension to an existing three-sided enclosure at **Land at Mackers Metals, Laindon Industrial Estate in Basildon**. This increased storage facility will accommodate recyclable wood and concrete which is currently stored in outside skips. No increase in site throughput, traffic or noise would result.

Flood and Water Management

Work has been completed on a scheme that should make homes more resilient against heavy rain in the future. Essex County Council Flood and Water Management team completed the implementation of the **new flood alleviation scheme in March 2016**. It aims to increase the resilience of 20 homes in the Wagtail Drive/Coppers Avenue area of Heybridge, which were previously prone to flooding after heavy rain.

The scheme included the creation of two detention basins with a low flow channel, in an area of unused open space with 2-3m high earth mounds. The scheme is designed to hold floodwater from heavy storms and take the pressure off the existing ditch that was unable to cope with heavy rain. The detention basin will be dry for most of the year with water confined to the low flow channel. The basin will only fill with water when heavy rainfall is experienced. The basins can store 2,450 m³ of water; the equivalent of volumes generated for a 1 in 100 year plus climate change flood event. The scheme received contributions from Maldon District Council and the Environment Agency provide a partnership approach to the scheme.

During the heavy rain experienced on 23 June the flood alleviation started to operate. From the picture below you can see that both detention basins have filled partly with water. The implementation of this scheme meant no incidences of flooding where reported for the area.



Following completion of the scheme, Councillor Mick Page, member of the Essex Flood Partnership explained that 'this scheme will give residents peace of mind whenever it rains heavily, that their homes are more resilient against flooding. Flood alleviation schemes such as this one are an essential investment in helping Essex residents to feel more secure and safe in their homes.'
