## **Essex County Council – Transport Local Authority of the Year 2017**

In mid-October, Essex County Council and the Essex Highways partnership was delighted to win 'Transport Local Authority of the Year' at this year's National Transport Awards. This award, which is the top national recognition a local authority can achieve, joins several others that the authority has won over the last two years.

## Help us help you – vegetation and trees



Now is the time of year when keen gardeners are out and about, putting their beloved gardens to bed, tidying things up and clearing stuff away for winter hibernation.

Although Essex Highways conducts a limited amount of work to cut back vegetation and trees on certain public highways, it is often the case that most of the obstructions to signs, footways and streetlights are caused by bushes and trees overhanging from private gardens, allotments, fields and trees. Please help us to help you, and all road and footpath users, by encouraging

your local residents and businesses to take prompt action to cut back anything inside their boundaries that is an obvious obstruction, at any height.

Equally important is the need to ensure that any leaves or other debris is properly removed from private land, so it doesn't blow onto the highway and block gullies. And lastly it is really important to remember that much of the flooding experienced on highways could be avoided if people who are responsible for private drainage works, like field ditches, take active steps to maintain and clear their own works, so preventing field run-off onto roads.

## **Superfast Essex Community Wi-Fi Scheme extended to all suppliers**

More Essex communities are being given an opportunity to set up a public wi-fi service as the Superfast Essex Community Wi-Fi Scheme is opened up to all suppliers.

Community hubs, such as village halls or community centres, can apply for up to £400 towards the cost of installing a superfast broadband service and setting up wi-fi on their premises.

The scheme was set up by Essex County Council's Superfast Essex broadband programme in September 2016 to encourage communities to make use of the upgraded infrastructure being installed by the superfast broadband rollout.

The funding is provided via Essex County Council's Community Initiatives Fund (CIF), a small grants scheme designed to support community projects.

In its first year the Community Wi-Fi scheme received 19 successful applications from community hubs, and five of those now have a live wi-fi service available. In response to feedback indicating that the list of only two potential suppliers was too restrictive, Superfast Essex has opened up the scheme and communities can now select a broadband service provider of their choice to install their superfast broadband and wi-fi service.

The scheme was officially re-launched at the Rural Community Council for Essex (RCCE) Village Halls Conference on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> October.

**Essex County Councillor Kevin Bentley, Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Economic Growth, Skills, Infrastructure, and the Digital Economy**, said:

"This scheme provides a great opportunity for communities to get online and access faster connectivity so it is great news the Community Initiatives Fund has agreed to support it for a second year. I encourage all communities without Wi-Fi currently to consider submitting an application and with an open choice of supplier there is even more choice."

## Planning News

### ***Minerals and Waste Policy Planning***

Essex County Council (ECC) and Southend-on-Sea Borough Council (SBC) have both adopted their joint prepared Waste Local Plan. ECC formally adopted the Plan on 11 July and SBC on 19 October 2017.

This Plan sets out the Councils' strategy and policies for waste development until 2032. The Plan forms part of the Development Plan in Essex and now officially replaces the Waste Local Plan adopted in 2001.

### ***Development Management news***

Planning application ESS/20/17/BTE to allow extended hours for the dry silo mortar plant at **Bradwell Quarry in Braintree** was considered by the Development & Regulation Committee on 27 October 2017. It was resolved to grant planning for a trial period of one year, to allow monitoring of the impacts.

### **Flood and Water Management**

As part of Essex County Council's **Rayleigh West flood alleviation scheme**, works to mitigate flood risk, which began in April, have now been completed.

This scheme centred on construction of two structures:

- The first; a bund across Sweyne Park School's sport fields which acts as a small earth dam containing water and releasing it into the drainage system at a manageable rate

- The second; an earth bank and wall positioned to increase the volume of Sweyne Park Pond and again control the rate of discharge.

These two measures both store water and release it at a controlled rate so the downstream drainage systems won't receive excessive flow from every major rainfall event.

This scheme is just one among many that the Flood and Water Management team are currently and have previously delivered to help protect Essex residents from flooding.
