
*Essex Highways Update* helping explain more about how we maintain and improve Essex' roads and related assets.

### Essex Highways – prepared for winter

The clocks go back at the end of October and, as the nights draw in, the changes signal the start of our Winter Service season, our roads gritting service. This year the service runs from 23 October, through to April.

During the summer we sent the gritting vehicles off for their service and more recently we have conducted practice route runs, so the drivers get to know the routes well in advance of any treatments.

This year 62 machines, plus two mini gritters will serve 57 gritting routes, including over 2000 miles of key routes in the county, the totality of which can be treated in less than three hours from start to finish. The winter service team use accurate weather forecasts from eight dedicated local weather stations and roadside sensors. The data is analysed by professional forecasters who then provide us with forecasts that inform our decisions about when and where to treat (“grit” is actually salt, or salt solution, known as brine) and how much salt to spread.

As you can see from the map above, we have divided Essex up into five weather areas, allowing us to either treat all areas, or one or more of them, according to local conditions. Conducting selective gritting is more economical and also allows for the fact that inland areas can often experience significantly different conditions to areas closer to the coast.

The Essex Highways gritting teams focus on key strategic routes including A and B roads plus at least one route serving settlements or parishes with 50+ households, we also treat access routes to ambulance, fire and police stations; bus routes with 4 or more a day for 5 days a week; and various sites of national strategic significance, such as refineries etc. You can see our gritting routes online at: <http://www.essexhighways.org/Roads-and-Pavements/winter-travel/salting-routes.aspx> - again, zoom in for detail.

As well as preparing our gritting routes, we also maintain other related infrastructure. Salt bins owned by ECC have already been topped up ready for drivers and pedestrians to treat local public roads and pavements – these will only get a second refill should there be a significant snow event, and only if resources allow. Deliveries to parish councils and communities signed up to the annual Salt Bag Partnership are now complete too - these supplies can be used support communities through periods of heavy snow and ice. We also work with District/City/Borough councils - they help clear priority footways, for instance in town centres, allowing our teams to focus on their road gritting shifts.

## **Landowners and householders asked to tidy up near roads ahead of winter**

As the weather turns colder, anyone with a garden or land bordering the road is being asked to make sure that ditches are cleared and overhanging trees and hedges are cut back.

Cllr Ian Grundy, Essex County Council Cabinet Member for Highways, said: "Ditches are the responsibility of landowners, even if they are next to the road. Blocked ditches cause flooding which in winter can turn into highly dangerous ice on the road so please do clear them now to avoid putting driver and pedestrians in unnecessary danger."

During storm Aileen earlier this month, highways crews were contacted about 21 separate incidents where trees blocked roads in Essex.

Cllr Grundy added: "Landowners also have responsibility for any trees near the road. These should be regularly checked and cut to prevent large branches or the whole tree blowing down and blocking the road. People walking along the pavement or verge shouldn't have to avoid overgrown trees or hedges.

"I'm sure everyone will want to act responsibly and take care of their own boundaries, to keep all of us safer this winter."

The Council has the power to issue enforcement notices to landowners with blocked ditches which flood the highway or with branches and vegetation found to be obstructing the highway, compelling the owner to carry out any necessary work.

Pavements should be entirely free of plant growth up to a height of 8ft (2.5m). The road should be clear to a height of 17ft (5.1m) and 1.8ft (0.5m) from the edge of the road towards your land.

The Council recommends the use of fully qualified and insured contractors to undertake any necessary work.

## It's a #CrimeNotToCare when it comes to getting rid of your rubbish

Fly-tipping is the illegal dumping of waste – anything from fridges or washing machines, to black bin bags and boxes – and it's a growing problem in Essex. In the past 12 months there have been 17, 547 fly-tipping incidents, costing over £1million of taxpayers money to clear up.

**#CrimeNotToCare** is helping ensure residents do the right thing with their rubbish and to reduce the amount of waste that is fly-tipped by rogue traders who offer to take people's waste away for money and then dump it.

Giving waste to a 'man with a van' who offers to get rid of it cheaply could end up proving costly for people and result in a criminal record.

**Remember** – if it's your waste, it's your responsibility. If your waste is found dumped, even if someone else has done it, you could be held responsible for the crime if you have not checked and recorded who you gave your waste to.

Protect yourself by following these tips:

- If you use a trader to remove your waste ask to see their waste carriers registration number issued by the Environment Agency:

- Check with the Environment Agency directly on 03708 506 506 for a free instant waste carrier check or online at <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/access-the-public-register-for-environmental-information>
- Don't be afraid to ask questions and ask for paperwork that shows where your waste is going. If in doubt, don't let them take your waste.
- Make a note of who you have given your waste to, their waste carrier number and vehicle details.
- Ensure that you receive a transfer notice or receipt before your waste is taken away.

Householders must make reasonable checks and businesses who produce commercial waste must keep waste transfer notes to comply with their waste duty of care.

You should never leave any waste such as an old washing machine or scrap metal on your drive or in the street for someone to remove. They may not be a registered waste carrier, and could take the bits they need and dump the rest.

If you have unwanted items, donate good quality items to local reuse organisations or charity shops. You should never leave items out for others to re-use as these could end up being dumped.

### *Development Management news*

On Friday 22 September Members of the Development and Regulation Committee approved an application for the erection of a single school building at **Home Farm County Primary School** in Colchester, ref CC/COL/40/17. The building will accommodate eight new classrooms and ancillary accommodation, together with an extension to the car park and associated landscaping.

Members also approved an application associated with **Land at Colchester Quarry (Bellhouse), Warren Lane, Stanway**. This application sought the continued use of the land for infilling without compliance of Condition 4 (Hours of Operation) attached to Planning Permission ESS/06/15/COL to allow the importation of both Local Authority Collected Municipal Waste and Household Waste Recycling Centre collected waste during the additional hours of 13:00 – 17:00 on Saturdays and 09:00 – 16:30 on Sundays.

At the same committee Members also approved an application for the temporary discharge of the requirement of Schedule 3 of the S106 agreement dated 21 June 2016 associated with planning consent ESS/39/14/BT for development at **Coleman's Farm**

**quarry, Rivenhall**, except for the restrictions of use on Little Braxted Lane or Oak Road to enable use of the access onto Braxted Road for all deliveries until 31 December 2017.
