A new 'Supporting Communities Fund' will make £1 million available to support getting new, locally-focussed services which support local communities off the ground,

The new fund was announced at ECC's budget meeting in February. Cllr Finch told the Council: "Local communities are best placed to understand the small but significant pieces of work, which will make a real difference to their lives and local areas, and this fund, for the first time gives them the money to help get their schemes off the ground."

## **Essex County Council**

### **Community Flood Improvement Fund grant**

Essex County Council set-aside £400,000 of its Capital Flood Prevention Programme to provide a Community Flood Improvement Fund grant for other authorities, charities, community groups, farmers and or landowners committed to delivering projects resulting in the reduction of flood risk to Essex residents.

The fund is specifically suited to address local drainage issues and the alleviation of minor drainage works. Furthermore the Flood and Water Management staff is available to provide any additional support needed during the grant application process.

Alphamstone and Lamarsh Parish Council benefited greatly from this grant in the 2015/16 phase of the scheme and during the 2016/17 phase of the scheme we received a total of 46 grant applications across a wide range of sectors and the applicants include

## Cash boost of over £1.2 million for communities across Essex

A sensory garden in Basildon, a centenary orchard near Colchester; a village shop in Blackmore; a home for the homeless in Braintree; a community garden in Loughton; a community minibus in Uttlesford, and a floating dock on the River Stour at Manningtree are just a handful of the innovative community projects across the county set to receive a share of almost £1¼ million from Essex County Council's Community Initiatives Fund (CIF).

In total, 122 projects will gain a share of £1,236,438 from the Fund this year, in a process which unlocks millions more pounds of funding for the projects from other local and national grant giving organisations.



Cllr Simon Walsh, Cabinet Member for Environment and Waste who leads the CIF programme, said: "Our congratulations to all the projects which attracted CIF funding this year. It is heartening to see the large amount of work that goes on in towns and villages around Essex at a local grassroots level to make life better for all of our residents."

"We also recognise the outstanding efforts made by all the successful applicants in attracting additional funding for their projects – which this year looks set to generate a further £10 million investment into the county."

Since it launched 10 years ago, CIF has injected almost £20 million directly into locally-led community projects. The annual fund, designed to support greener, safer and healthier communities, allocates up to £120,000 for each of the twelve districts in the county (excluding Southend and Thurrock).

Cllr John Aldridge, Chairman of Essex County Council, said: "All the successful applicants convinced us of strong local need and community support for their project – so we very much look forward to seeing projects taking shape and having a positive impact on the lives of local people. We also wish to congratulate all those who volunteer so much of their time to make these projects a reality."

The application process for the next round of CIF is expected to be open from April 2017.

## ***A selection of local projects from the 2016/17 round of CIF:***

**Stour Sailing Club in Manningtree** will receive £10,000 to increase and improve access to sailing and rowing activities with the purchase of a new floating dock.

Tim Goodwin, Commodore Stour Sailing Club: “The funding will make a big contribution to improving local access to water sports activities through helping to provide floating platforms for our Club Rowing Gig, Safety Boat and Dinghies. This will make it much easier for people of all ages to get on and off the water safely to row and sail, and will mean that more people are able to participate and to and enjoy our beautiful estuary.”

**Braintree BMX Club** will receive £12,000 for fresh tarmacking of the Braintree BMX track’s berms (banked corners).

Julian Allen, Head Coach, XLR8 Bike School/Braintree BMX Club said: “The funding for the track will be a great help to the club to be able to ensure the facility can continue to enhance the opportunities for BMX riders in the local community. With the berms (corners) being tarmacked for the first time since 2009, we can aim to expand our coaching programme to help more people participate in the sport safely.”

**Blackmore Village Hall** will receive £20,000 for the conversion of an under used squash court in the hall into a community shop.

Chris Blackwell, Treasurer of Blackmore Village Hall, said: “The Village Hall project will effectively make a central point for residents to meet and provide an essential area to promote social interaction. The Village Hall Committee is delighted to be the recipient of this generous CIF grant.”

**Above and Beyond in Epping Forest** will receive £11,000 towards the GROW Community Garden on unused land owned by Loughton Town Council.



Anne Redelinghuys of GROW Community Garden said: “GROW is a safe place to make friends, while benefitting from mental and physical health and wellbeing. For the past 4 ½ months the fight was to get the brambles dug out. With that now done and the money received, we can look forward to the building of the raised beds and getting the necessary structures in place. Thank you to CIF and the support from all involved!”

Established by Essex County Council in 1999, the Essex Book Festival has gone from strength to strength and is now run by a charitable trust from the Centre for Creative Writing at the University of Essex in Colchester.

With over 90 events taking place across the county, bibliophiles, culture vultures and people who simply like a laugh will love the roster of brilliant minds and creative talent descending on libraries, theatres, hotels and lecture halls throughout March 2017.

Although some popular events are sold out - such as the one involving Waterstones Book of the Year 2016 winner Sarah Perry, from Chelmsford – there is still plenty on offer.

## Planning News

### Minerals and Waste Policy Planning

Examination of the Essex and Southend-on-Sea **Replacement Waste Local Plan** has been underway since June 2016. The hearing sessions began on Tuesday 27 September and adjourned on 7 October. As part of the examination process, the Planning Inspector has requested that a number of modifications be made in order for the Plan to be found sound and consequently suitable for adoption.

Public consultation on the **schedule of modifications** closed on 16 February 2017 with more than 550 comments received from around 370 individuals and organisations. Responses are being processed and analysed now before being passed to the Inspector for consideration as part of the preparation of her final report. This is anticipated in April 2017 and, if deemed sound, the Plan will be adopted by the Authorities in July.

### Development Management News

On 24 February the Development & Regulation Committee considered a planning application for a new two-storey two Form Entry primary school and single storey 52 place early years centre/nursery with associated car, cycle and scooter parking, hard play areas, means of enclosure and landscaping and associated infrastructure on a 2.67 hectare site at **The Chase, Newhall, Harlow, CM17 6JA (Ref CC/HLW/56/16)**. The Committee resolved to grant planning permission.

The Development & Regulation Committee also considered two planning applications in relation to **Highwood Quarry, Stortford Road Little Canfield, Dunmow, CM6 1SL (Ref ESS/34/16/UTT & ESS/35/16/UTT)** relating to allowing lorries to leave the site between 6-7am and also to regularise the height of an existing structure. The Committee resolved to refuse planning permission for the early hours on the grounds it would introduce industrial operations early in the morning in a rural setting and would cause harm to local amenity. The Committee agreed to the regularising of the height of the structure.

## Flood and Water Management

Essex County Council has initiated a **Property Level Protection grant scheme** which is available to all residents in Essex (excluding Thurrock and Southend).

The recipients of the grants are residential homeowners who have been flooded internally in the past from ordinary watercourse/groundwater/surface water flooding, can provide evidence of the impact of the flooding event and have not had the opportunity of applying for the Repair and Renew grants or would not be included in any flood alleviation scheme to be undertaken by any Risk Management Authority in Essex. By delivering this £5,000 per property grant, our long-term plan is to provide assistance to flooded residents in Essex by helping them become more resilient and resistant to future flooding by providing them with Property Level Protection as well as promoting community-wide flood risk awareness.

Examples of previous grants include reinforced flood doors, sump pumps, air brick covers and non-return valves to prevent flood water coming into the house and improving drainage. In total, 50 installations have been completed so far in the 2016/17 phase of the project; this brings the total number of installations to 96 since the scheme was launched in September 2015. Therefore 96 previously flooded Essex residents are better protected from future flooding episodes.
