

November Report for Parish Councils regarding Essex County Council - Cllr Penny Channer, Maldon Division, ECC.

Essex County Council's (ECC) flagship property development was officially unveiled on 24 October 2018.

Goldlay Square, a 32 unit development in Chelmsford, is part of a wider £42 million project to help tackle Essex's housing shortage.

The development was the site of ECC's former library headquarters before it became surplus to requirements in 2015. It is now an exceptional residential development that offers much needed housing. The development has recently been shortlisted in the 'Inside Housing Development Awards 2018' for the 'Best Development (under 70 units) Award'.

Comprising of 23 apartments for private sale and 9 affordable units, the site consists of three buildings which face onto a central garden area incorporating artwork from renowned artist Les Bicknell.

The completion of Goldlay Square represents a real milestone in our mission to tackle the county's housing shortage."

It is an exceptional development, built on surplus brownfield land at the heart of the city. With the launch of these homes, Essex Housing have not only created much needed housing, they have transformed a previously underutilised site.

Essex Housing was set up to help tackle the housing shortage by redeveloping surplus buildings and land at risk of lying empty and drifting into disrepair. The council recognises the importance housing plays in enabling a broad range of positive outcomes for the residents of Essex.

Working with local councils and other public sector bodies like the NHS, ECC is spending £42 million to speed up the supply of much-needed housing.

The innovative approach by Essex Housing is attracting significant interest nationally. It is already bringing forward a total of 605 homes on

a range of sites across the county, 266 of which already have planning permission secured.

The in house developer has recently started work on 26 new homes at Moulsham Lodge in Chelmsford and has just completed 6 affordable units which will be sold to a registered provider, in Norton Road, Brentwood.

Meanwhile, feasibility studies are complete or underway for another 27 potential development sites.

The Super Sam Digital Challenge Badge, fronted by the Essex County Council broadband programme's mascot Super Sam, is open to all Essex members of Girlguiding Anglia to complete between now and 31st January 2019.

To achieve the Super Sam Digital Challenge Badge, members of Rainbows (age five to seven years), Brownies (age seven to 10 years), Guides (age 10 to 14 years) and Rangers (age 14 to 18 years), from within the three Essex county regions of Girlguiding Anglia (Essex North East, Essex South East and Essex West) must complete a selection of compulsory tasks followed by other age appropriate digital tasks.

It is one of a number of initiatives being supported by Superfast Essex and Essex County Council to help encourage people to do more digitally and raise awareness of the possibilities of what can be achieved online as public and private services are increasingly being transformed to digital platforms.

One of these is the Essex-wide Digital Boomers initiative which is aiming to help older people in Essex live more independently with the help of digital applications and assistive technology so that by 2021, older people in Essex are the most tech confident in the world.

As superfast broadband coverage is increasing across the county, driven by the Superfast Essex programme's subsidised rollout, Essex

County Council wants to encourage the county's residents to subscribe to the upgraded internet services and benefit from the opportunities offered by faster connectivity.

We want to make sure people make the most of the new infrastructure we are building and also help to highlight the opportunities and capabilities that come with digital access.

As public and consumer services are increasingly becoming digitised it is important we don't leave anyone behind and help now to avoid social isolation due to lack of digital skills or confidence.

A selection of Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers from across the region came together with their parents, grandparents and great grandparents at Chelmsford Library at to mark the launch of the badge and start the challenge.

It gives the young members the opportunity to take part in an important project to support older people to go digital. Digital partnerships like this may also encourage girls to develop new technology skills which inspire them into STEM careers such as computer programming or engineering

All Girlguides who complete Super Sam's Digital Challenge Badge will receive a badge for their achievement.

[Essex Trading Standards \(ETS\)](#)

Essex Trading Standards has licenced over 200 premises for the sale of fireworks for this year's season.

Unless they are licenced for all year round selling, retailers are permitted to sell fireworks from 15th October until 10th November, on the day of

Diwali, the 26th to the 31st December, Chinese New Year and the 3 days immediately after.

Essex Trading Standards continued resource into this area is largely to ensure that retailers manage the risk associated with fireworks in terms of storage and sale.

In terms of storage there are very strict requirements and in the weeks leading up to the main selling period officers visited 100% of new licence applications as well as those where ETS have had cause to issue non-compliance notices to in previous years. ETS have responded to complaints and monitored social media for reports in particular areas of young people using fireworks for ASB and that helps ETS direct the inspections to the right areas.

In terms of ensuring a robust approach around restricting the sale of fireworks to under 18's – ETS do carry out a series of test purchases every year and can report that ETS have had 100% compliance in the areas tested this year.

The training aim is to assist and support food businesses with allergen labelling and controls within the workplace

Rogue Trader Warning!

Trading Standards has been receiving increased intelligence reports from consumers being approached by cold callers pointing out that there are tiles missing from their roofs.

Upon inspection they are shown tiles lying in the garden to support this and it appears that in some cases residents are recalling noises during the night where we suspect these individuals may have been climbing onto people's roofs and damaging them in order to engage the resident with offers of remedial work.

This is extremely concerning and in the first instance any disturbance at the property followed up by cold calls of this nature must be reported to Essex Police on 101 - Do not engage with these traders at the door, further advice and guidance can be gained by calling the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 03454 040506. If rectification work is required then go on strict recommendation or use Buy With Confidence
